

Roberto Gianola boasts significant collaborations that have led him to conduct orchestras worldwide: Europe, USA, Central and South America, Russia, Turkey, Egypt, China, Korea, Japan, and the United Arab Emirates.

Principal Conductor of the Izmir State Opera and Ballet since May 2023, he was also the Music

Director of the Istanbul State Opera for 9 years, conducting numerous operas, concerts, and ballets. He has been a guest at prestigious venues such as the Musikverein in Vienna, Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall in New York, Seoul Arts Center, Smetana Hall in Prague, Sala Verdi in Milan, and theaters in Hong Kong, Beijing, and Macau. He has collaborated with esteemed Italian institutions like the Arena di Verona, Teatro Lirico di Cagliari, Teatro Verdi di Trieste, Teatro Regio di Parma, Teatro Del Giglio di Lucca, and orchestras such as I Pomeriggi Musicali di Milano, Orchestra Regionale della Toscana, Orchestra del Festival Pucciniano, I Virtuosi del Teatro alla Scala and many others. In recent seasons, he conducted Capuleti e Montecchi and Il Trovatore at the Ljubljana Opera and the ballets Sleeping Beauty, Don Quixote, Norma, and Falstaff in Istanbul. He also conducted Don Pasquale at Teatro Verdi in Trieste, Manon Lescaut at Teatro del Giglio in Lucca, Elisir d'Amore at Teatro Lirico di Cagliari, Cavalleria Rusticana in Livorno, Don Pasquale and Il Paese dei Campanelli at Teatro Coccia di Novara, and La Bohème at Kithakyushu Opera in Japan, Opera Fuerteventura, and Hong Kong Opera. The 2024 season saw him conduct Romeo et Juliette at Hong Kong Opera, The Nutcracker (Ballet) at Ljubljana Opera, La Bohème and Traviata at Izmir Opera, Turandot at Skopje Opera, as well as concerts in Austria, Bulgaria, and China, where he led a tour of 25 concerts in January. In 2025, he is set to debut with Otello in Maribor, Slovenia, return to Ljubljana with Il Trovatore, and embark on a new tour in China.

As Artistic Director, he founded the Lake Como Philharmonic Orchestra and the Lake Como Music Academy on Lake Como, which have stood out for organizing major events (operas and concerts), competitions, and masterclasses over 20 years. His discography includes a Stradivarius CD with the Orchestra I Pomeriggi Musicali di Milano and a CD featuring works by Respighi recorded with the Orchestra Sinfonica di Sanremo and published by the magazine Amadeus.
